

M. GUILLAUX COMING TO ALBURY.

Next Saturday Albury residents will have an opportunity of witnessing the aviation flights of Monsieur Guillaux, absolutely the greatest aviator the world has produced. No words can describe what he does and can do. All other aviators pale before him; looping the loop at an altitude of 10,000 feet is mere child's play to him. He braves no fear, and seems heretofore of nerves. He back-somersaults in the air, does perpendicular dives, spiral descents, flies up-side-down (which is more than the winged bird does). In fact, he plays with his aeroplane as if it were a child's toy. One hundred and twenty thousand people witnessed his flights in Victoria Park, Sydney, and they were electrified. When in Newcastle, three weeks ago, he offered a wager that he would leave Newcastle at 8 a.m. and reach Melbourne at 2 p.m. six hours to do 600 miles. He flew from Biarritz, in France, to Kollum, in Holland, 1000 miles, in 12½ hours, and passed over Mount Blanc (32,000ft). He holds the record for the quickest flight from Paris to London in 4½ hours, accompanied by four passengers. He won the Pommery Cup, beating the greatest aviators in the world. Thanks to Messrs. Egan and Griffith, this great aviator is coming to Albury. At Wagga 10,000 people paid to see him. The flights will take place on the same course, and the prices and special trains will be the same as those of Handley when here in March.
