

AVIATION DISPLAYS YESTERDAY

GUILLAUX CHAIRED AT MELBOURNE.

MELBOURNE, Saturday Night.

At the Melbourne Show Ground to-day, in the presence of 10,000 spectators, including the Governor-General, Lady Helen Munro-Ferguson, and party, Aviator Guillaux gave a fine display. The weather was showery and the wind fairly strong. The first flight lasted twenty minutes. Guillaux rose about 1000 feet, circled several times, and then dived perpendicularly and gave an exhibition of spiral vol-

planing. Towards the finish he looped the loop once. The movement was not very effective, however, as the wind caught the machine. Guillaux descended, the rain preventing him from seeing well. The second flight lasted 25 minutes, and was a very good display. The machine rose about 4500 feet. The aviator made a magnificent S dive, and gave an exhibition of side-slipping and upside-down flying.

Guillaux then flew over Moonee Valley, Brunswick, and Essendon; and returning, looped four times in succession. At the close of the flight the crowd rushed on the ground and prevented further exhibition. Guillaux was chaired and carried round the ground.

The display is easily the best yet given in Melbourne.
