## TEA FIRM READY TO ASSIST

The Lipton Tea company is willing to make a donation towards provision of a cairn in Harden to commemorate the landing here of French aviator Maurice Guillaux.

However, the company has stipulated that it would only participate in the project if certain other companies did likewise.

The information was received by the Apex Club in reply to a letter seeking assistance to erect a commemorative cairn.

The idea of erecting a suitable monument in Harden was put forward when the recent re-enactment flight of the 50th anniversary of air mail passed through Harden.

Guillaux, who carried the first air mail between Sydney and Melbourne, stopped over in Harden two nights during his flight in 1914.

The other companies mentioned in the letter to the Apex Club sponsored the commemorative flight in association with Lipton's.
