CLASS OF GROUND: Aerodrome licensed for all types of landplanes in dry weather only.

PROPRIETOR: C.A.Y. Johnston, Esq., Alexandria Station, N.T.

POSITION: Immediately S.W. of Alexandria homestead.
Lat. 19° 2½' S. Long. 136° 42' E.

MAGNETIC VARIATION: 4½° E. approx.

LANDMARKS: Homestead buildings and stockyards immediately N.E.
The letters "ALEX" are painted on the roof of the W/T hut.

MARKINGS: White circle and wind indicator.
SURFACE: Black soil, suitable in dry weather only.

DIMENSIONS: 660 yards square. HEIGHT ABOVE SEA LEVEL: 800 ft. approx.

APPROACHES: W/T masts 60 ft. high, windmills and buildings to N.E. Remainder clear.

SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Principally open black soil plains, except to the north and west.

PETROL AND OIL: Limited supplies at homestead.

WATER SUPPLY: Homestead.

WORKSHOPS: Homestead garage. HANGAR ACCOMMODATION: Nil.

TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH: Wireless station at homestead. NEAREST TOWN: Camooweal, 150 miles by road. NEAREST RAILWAY STATION: Mt. Isa, 250 miles by road.

CHARGES: N11.
