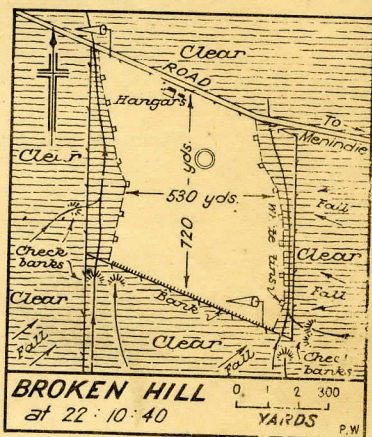
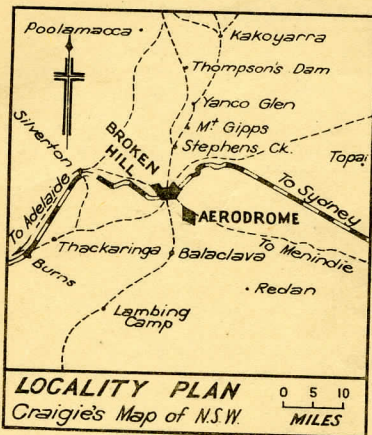

LATITUDE: $31^{\circ}59'$ S. LONGITUDE: $141^{\circ}31'$ E. MAG. VAR: 6° E. app.
ALTITUDE: 980 feet approx.

POSITION: About 3 miles SE of Broken Hill, on S side of Menindie Road.

RELEVANT AVIATION MAPS: Mercator Sheet J.7. Stripmap No.51.
SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Generally open and suitable for forced landings.

LANDMARKS: Road along N boundary; hangar and sheds on N portion of aerodrome.

APPROACHES: Clear on all sides.

MARKINGS: White circle, wind indicator and boundary marks.

DIMENSIONS: N-S, 720 yards; E-W, 530 yards.

SURFACE: Sandy, partly grassed. Slightly undulating near SW corner and somewhat loose along S boundary.

TOWN & RAILWAY STATION: Broken Hill, 3 miles NW.

TELEPHONE: At hangar (Broken Hill 66).

HANGARS: One hangar $50' \times 40'$. Aero Clubhouse alongside.

REPAIRS: Broken Hill.

REFUELLING: On aerodrome.

WATER: On aerodrome.

PROPRIETORS: Department of Civil Aviation, Melbourne.

CHARGES: Nil.
