

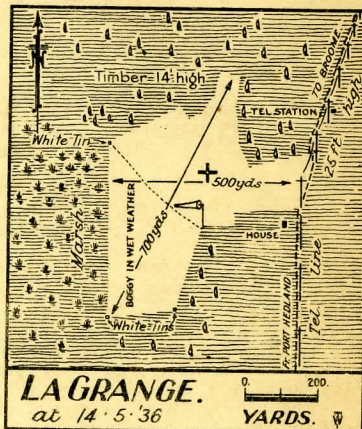
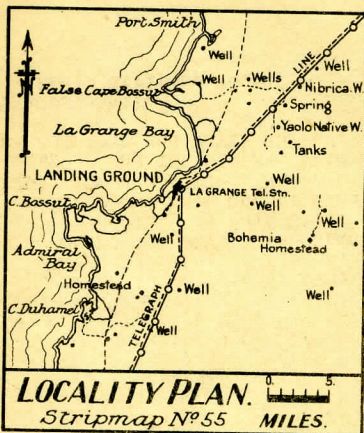

CLASS OF GROUND: Emergency Landing Ground.
PROPRIETORS: Civil Aviation Board, Melbourne.
POSITION: Immediately West of La Grange Telegraph Station.
 Lat.: 18° 41' S.; Long.: 121° 45' E.
MAGNETIC VARIATION: 1½ East approx.
LANDMARKS: La Grange Tel. Station, house and tel. line to East.
MARKINGS: White cross and wind indicator.
SURFACE: Sandy surface, inclined to be soft.
DIMENSIONS: N.E.-S.W. 700 yards; E.-W. 500 yards.
HEIGHT ABOVE SEA LEVEL: 25 feet approx.
APPROACHES: East - over tel. line 25 ft. high; North and South - timber to 14 ft. high; West - open over marsh.
SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Scrubby to the North; plain country to the South, subject to inundation.
PETROL, OIL and WORKSHOPS: Broome, about 90 miles North-East.
WATER SUPPLY: Post Office and house nearby.
HANGAR ACCOMMODATION: Nil.
TELEPHONE and TELEGRAPH: Telegraph Station adjoining.
NEAREST TOWN and SEAPORT: Broome.
CHARGES: Nil.
REMARKS: The South-West portion of the ground is boggy in wet weather (see sketch).
