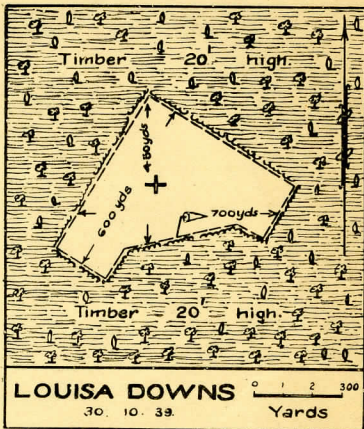
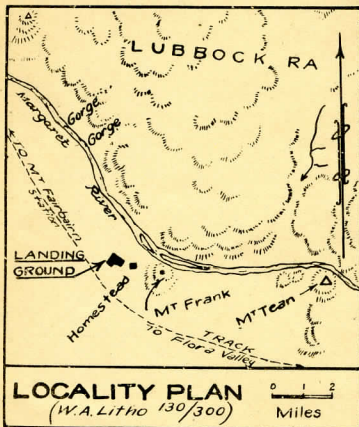

EMERGENCY LANDING GROUND



LATITUDE: $18^{\circ} 42' S$; LONGITUDE: $126^{\circ} 42' E$; MAG. VAR. $2\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E$.
ALTITUDE: 550 feet approx.
POSITION: $\frac{1}{4}$ mile east of Homestead.
RELEVANT AVIATION MAPS: Mercator Sheet E.5, Stripmap No. 56.
SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Timbered. Generally unsuitable for forced landings.
LANDMARKS: Homestead, track and Margaret River.
APPROACHES: Over timber and scrub 20 ft. high in all directions.
MARKINGS: White cross and wind indicator.
DIMENSIONS: N-S, 450 yds; NE-SW, 600 yds; E-W, 700 yds
SURFACE: Fair - should be firm in all weathers.

TOWN and SEAPORT: Derby, 300 miles west.
TELEGRAPH: Hall's Creek Post Office 100 miles east.
HANGARS: Nil.
REPAIRS: Blacksmith shop at Homestead.
REFUELLING: Limited supply at Homestead.
WATER: At Homestead.

CHARGES: Nil.
