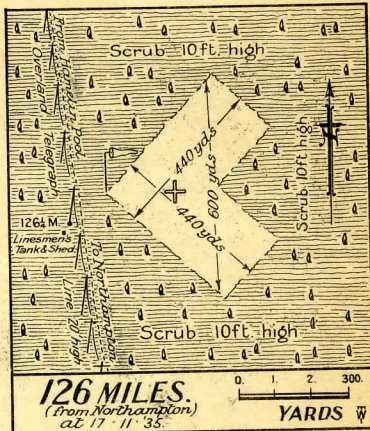
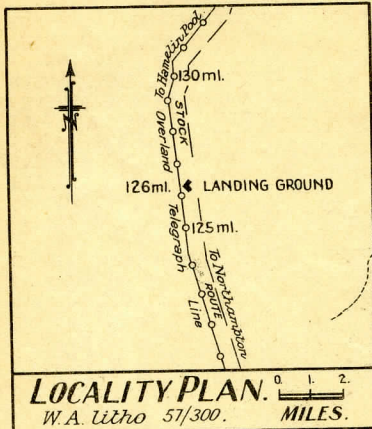


NOTICE TO AIRMEN

126-MILE, W.A.



CLASS OF GROUND: Emergency Landing Ground.

PROPRIETORS: Civil Aviation Board, Melbourne.

POSITION: Immediately East of overland telegraph line; 126 miles North from Northampton, or 15 miles South of Hamelin Pool. Lat.: 26° 36' S. Long.: 114° 9' E.

MAGNETIC VARIATION: 3° West.

LANDMARKS: Overland telegraph line immediately West; linesmen's tank and shed near West corner of ground.

MARKINGS: White cross and wind indicator.

SURFACE: Fairly firm sandy surface.

DIMENSIONS: N.E. - S.W. 440 yards; N.W. - S.E. 440 yards; North-South 600 yards.

HEIGHT ABOVE SEA LEVEL: 150 ft. approx.

APPROACHES: Over scrub about 10 feet high on all sides; tel. line 20 feet high about 100 yards to West of western corner of ground.

SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Scrubby sand plain.

PETROL AND OIL: Limited supply at Hamelin Pool Homestead, about 15 miles North.

WATER SUPPLY: Linesmen's tank 150 yards S.W. of wind indicator.

WORKSHOPS: Blacksmith's shop at Hamelin Pool Homestead.

HANGAR ACCOMMODATION: Nil.

TELEPHONE: Tel. line 100 yards West of ground could be tapped in emergency.

TELEGRAPH: Hamelin Pool tel. station 15 miles North.

NEAREST TOWN: Hamelin Pool.

REMARKS: This ground should only be used in case of emergency, its surface is better than the 95 mile or the 115 mile grounds, but northern portion of ground is boggy after rain. Strip-map No. 53.
