IT is hereby notified that an Emergency Landing Ground has been established at MEILMAN, NEW SOUTH WALES.

The following particulars regarding this Emergency Landing Ground are published for information:—

<i>Proprietors</i>	Commonwealth of Australia, on licence under C.A. Form 22 from Meilman Land Syndicate.
<i>Position</i>	Latitude, 34° 33' S.; longitude, 142° 56' E. Situated on the south side of the Euston-Balranald-road, 10 miles north-east of Euston, 2 miles east of Lake Benanee, and 2 miles north of Lake Caringy.
<i>Distinctive Features</i> ..	Main road to north and track on west side. Lake Benanee 2 miles to west and Lake Caringy 2 miles south.
<i>Markings</i>	Ground marking (white cross). Wind indicator on western boundary.
<i>Description</i>	Large area, roughly L shape. Good surface, suitable in all weathers.
<i>Dimensions for Landing</i>	North and south, 750 yards. East and west, 500 yards.
<i>Height above Sea Level</i>	About 250 feet.
<i>Magnetic Variation</i> ..	7° E. (approx.).
<i>Approaches</i>	North, low mallee. South, open, then low mallee. East, low mallee. West, open, except for fence.
<i>Surrounding Country</i> ..	Timbered and dangerous, except near lake, where the country is open but surface very bad.
<i>Petrol and Oil</i>	Euston.
<i>Water Supply</i>	Lake, 2 miles west.
<i>Workshops</i>	Balranald, 37 miles east, for minor repairs.
<i>Hangar Accommodation</i>	Nil.
<i>Nearest Telephone</i> ..	None in the vicinity.
<i>Nearest Telegraph</i> ..	Euston, 12 miles south-west.
<i>Nearest Town</i>	Euston, 12 miles south-west.
<i>Nearest Railway Station</i>	Robinvale, about 13 miles south-west.
<i>Charges</i>	Nil.
<i>Remarks</i>	Ground replaces Lake Benanee emergency landing ground on the Mildura-Hay route, and Lake Benanee ground will no longer be maintained.
