


LATITUDE: 34° 06' S; LONGITUDE: 150° 441' E; MAG. VAR: 9° E app. ALTITUDE: 250 feet approx.
POSITION: On racecourse 13 miles N of Menangle; 1 mile N of railway bridge over Nepean River.
RELEVANT AVIATION MAPS: Mercator Sheet J.9. Stripmap Nos.10

and 12.

SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Generally suitable for forced landings. Beware of stumps and washouts hidden by long grass. LANDMARKS: Racecourse, railway to E, Nepean River to W. APPROACHES: North and south - clear; east - over building

and 45' timber; west - over 45' timber.
MARKINGS: White cross and wind indicator.
DIMENSIONS: N-S, 850 yards; E-W, 380 yards. SURFACE: Fair.

TOWN: Menangle, 13 miles S. RAILWAY STATION: North Menangle siding adjacent. TELEPHONE: At house to S. HANGARS: Nil. REPAIRS & REFUELLING: Menangle. WATER: At house to S of river.

PROPRIETORS: Department of Civil Aviation, Melbourne. CHARGES: Nil.

SPECIAL REMARKS: Race meetings often held on racecourse. Landing area is narrow in E-W direction, as marked by white tins.
