

LATITUDE: 16° 40' S; LONGITUDE: 133° 24' E; MAG. VAR: 4° E app. ALTITUDE: 800 feet approx. LATITUDE:

POSITION: 28 miles south of Daly Waters.

RELEVANT AVIATION MAPS: Mercator Sheet E.6, Stripmap No.7.
SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Rough and unsuitable for forced landings.
LANDMARKS: Clearing in timber on north-eastern side of overland telegraph line. Station buildings and bore 12 miles south on road and overland telegraph line.

APPROACHES: Timber felled back 10 chains from ends of landing

strips. MARKINGS: White cross, wind indicator, and corner marks.

DIMENSIONS: NE-SW, 610 yards long x 150 yards wide. NW-SE,

980 yards long x 150 yards wide.

SURFACE: Good level surface, satisfactory in all weather.

TOWN: Newcastle Waters, 50 miles south approx. RAILWAY STATION: Birdum 78 miles north. TELEPHONE: "Dunmara" Homestead, 12 miles south.

HANGARS: Nil. REPAIRS: Nil.

REFUELLING: Daly Waters, 30 miles north by road. WATER: No.6 Bore about 12 miles south alongside road.

PROPRIETORS: Civil Aviation Department, Melbourne. CHARGES: N11.
