

AIR FORCE PLANE DOWN

Strikes Tree: Crew Unhurt

3/ Sydney, January 16.
 An Air Force aeroplane, flying from Richmond (N.S.W.) to Melbourne, crashed between Moss Vale and Exeter to-day.
 Flight-Commander Charlesworth was in charge, and had with him Mr. Dell Johnston as mechanic. They left Richmond at 6 o'clock, and had to feel the way owing to a dense fog. The plane was observed flying very low over Moss Vale; and at ten minutes to seven o'clock a tree was struck on the Collingwood property of Mr. A. G. Brown. The plane turned completely over, and was much damaged. The men were unhurt.
