LICENSED AERODROME, "B" CLASS



LATITUDE: $33^{\circ} 08\frac{1}{2}'$ S; LONGITUDE: $148^{\circ} 09\frac{1}{2}'$ E; MAG. VAR: 7° E app.
ALTITUDE: 1,030 feet approx.

POSITION: One mile SSW of Parkes on E side of Parkes-Forbes railway line.

RELEVANT AVIATION MAPS: Mercator Sheet J.9. Stripmaps Nos. 8 and 10.

SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Generally flat and cultivated, with patches of timber suitable for forced landings.

LANDMARKS: Railway line along W boundary; rail junction about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile NW.

APPROACHES: North, south and east - clear. West - over 18 feet telegraph line.

MARKINGS: White circle and wind indicator.

DIMENSIONS: NNE-SSW, 800 yards. WNW-ESE, 900 yards.

SURFACE: Fair.

TOWN & RAILWAY STATION: Parkes, about 1 mile NNE.

TELEPHONE: Texaco Depot adjacent (Parkes 322).

HANGARS: Nil.

REPAIRS & REFUELLING: Parkes.

WATER: At house to NE of aerodrome.

PROPRIETORS: Parkes Municipal Council.

CHARGES: Nil at present.

SPECIAL REMARKS: Sheep grazed. Pilots intending to visit this ground should notify the Town Clerk (Tel. No. 8).
