



## NOTICE TO AIRMEN

BAYNTON, VIC.



CLASS OF GROUND: Emergency Landing Ground.

PROPRIETORS: Civil Aviation Board, Melbourne.

POSITION: Situated  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles South-East of Baynton and 11 miles North-East of Kyneton.Lat:  $37^{\circ} 9' S$ . Long:  $144^{\circ} 37' E$ .MAGNETIC VARIATION:  $8^{\circ} E$ . approx.

LANDMARKS: Cleared area in angle of two roads bordered by timber.

MARKINGS: White cross and wind indicator.

SURFACE: Slightly rough and undulating, grassy surface.

DIMENSIONS: North-South 600 yards. East-West 550 yards.

HEIGHT ABOVE SEA LEVEL: 1,600 feet approx.

APPROACHES: North & West - Over trees along road, gaps in trees.  
South & East - Over very scattered dead timber. Tree 35 ft. high on South corner.

SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Hilly and timbered to South-East. Elsewhere hilly with some good level patches. Except to South-East, fair forced-landing country.

PETROL, OIL and WORKSHOPS: Kyneton, 11 miles South-West.

WATER SUPPLY: House, or creek to North-East.

HANGAR ACCOMMODATION: Nil.

TELEPHONE and TELEGRAPH: Post Office, Baynton.

NEAREST TOWN and RAILWAY STATION: Kyneton.

CHARGES: Nil.

REMARKS: A fair emergency landing ground.
