



LATITUDE:  $35^{\circ}18\frac{1}{2}'$  S. LONGITUDE:  $149^{\circ}11\frac{1}{2}'$  E. MAG.VAR:  $10^{\circ}$  E. app.  
ALTITUDE: 1,850 feet approx.

POSITION:  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles E of City of Canberra.

RELEVANT AVIATION MAPS: Mercator Sheet K.9. Stripmaps Nos. 4 and 73.

SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Flat in immediate vicinity; generally hilly and mountainous otherwise.

LANDMARKS: Day: City of Canberra.

Night: Airway Light on Mt. Ainslie, 3 miles NNW of aerodrome. Altitude 2,920 feet (1,070 feet above aerodrome), elevation  $2^{\circ}$  above horizon, 6 r.p.m. visible 80 miles.

APPROACHES: Clear in all directions.

MARKINGS: White circle and two wind indicators.

LIGHTING: Two illuminated wind indicators. Orange lights around limits of landing area. Red obstruction lights on buildings and radio masts.

Note: Lights operated on request. Apply to Civic Branch, Department of Interior, Canberra.

DIMENSIONS: N-S, 1,760 yards; E-W, 1,930 yards.

SURFACE: Good, but liable to be soft and sticky in wet weather.

TOWN & RAILWAY STATION: Canberra,  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles W.

TELEPHONE: On aerodrome.

HANGARS: One hangar 140' x 80' and anchor blocks. Compass Base (on ground mark).

REPAIRS: Canberra.

REFUELLING: On aerodrome.

WATER: On aerodrome.

PROPRIETORS: Civic Branch, Department of Interior, Canberra.  
Mr. C.S.Daley, Assistant Secretary.

CHARGES: 1-2 seater  $2/6$  per landing, 10/- per day.
