



## NOTICE TO AIRMEN

NO. 78/1935.

(ON BATHURST ISLAND)

CAPE FOURCROY, N.T.



CLASS OF GROUND: Emergency landing ground.

PROPRIETORS: Commonwealth of Australia (Controller of Civil Aviation, Melbourne).

POSITION: Near S.W. extremity of Bathurst Island,  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile N.E. of Cape Fourcroy. Lat:  $11^{\circ}47'S.$ , Long:  $130^{\circ}3'E.$ MAGNETIC VARIATION:  $4^{\circ}E.$  approx.LANDMARKS: Cape Fourcroy  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile S.W. Low sandhill on Cape Fourcroy.

MARKINGS: White Cross and wind indicator.

SURFACE: Good sandy loam surface, possibly heavy after heavy rain.

DIMENSIONS: N.E. - S.W. 880 yds. N.W. - S.E. 440 yds.

HEIGHT ABOVE SEA LEVEL: 30 ft. approx.

APPROACHES: Clear over cliffs to west, clear over felled areas to N. and S., heavily timbered jungle to east.

SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Heavy jungle; sandy beaches to north.

PETROL AND OIL: At landing ground.

WATER SUPPLY: 200 gallon tank under bough shed at landing ground; fresh water seepage from cliffs nearby during wet season.

WORKSHOPS: At Mission 40 miles east.

HANGAR ACCOMMODATION: Nil.

TELEGRAPH: W/T. at Mission 40 miles east, at S.E. extremity of island.

NEAREST TOWN: At Mission.

RAILWAY STATION: Nil; nearest port, Darwin 65 miles, by air, S.E.

CHARGES: Nil.

REMARKS: Tap on tank secured by combination lock; key word is DERBY. Visitors please fasten before departure to check waste by aborigines.
