

## NOTICES TO AIRMEN.

## No. 26 of 1925.

IT is hereby notified that an Emergency Landing Ground has been established at GARTH, VICTORIA.

The following particulars regarding this Emergency Landing Ground are published for information:—

<i>Proprietors</i> .. ..	Commonwealth of Australia, on licence under C.A. Form 22 from Mr. S. Metcalf, "Garth," Carlsruhe.
<i>Position</i> .. ..	Latitude, 37° 18' S.; longitude, 144° 33' E. Situated 4½ miles north of Woodend.
<i>Distinctive Features</i> ..	Angle on road at south-west corner. Area is part of old swamp which has been drained, and is distinctive as clear plain.
<i>Markings</i> .. ..	Ground marking (white cross). Wind indicator in south-east corner.
<i>Description</i> .. ..	Large flat, part of old swamp. Covered with heavy grass and some thistles. Surface fair.
<i>Dimensions for Landing</i>	North and south, 670 yards. East and west, 570 yards.
<i>Height above Sea Level</i>	About 1,800 feet.
<i>Magnetic Variation</i> ..	7° 54' E. (approximately).
<i>Approaches</i> .. ..	Clear, except for low fences on north, south, and west.
<i>Surrounding Country</i> ..	Northwards and eastwards hilly and timbered. Remainder level, some timber, mostly open. Immediate surroundings clear, except timber south-west.
<i>Petrol and Oil</i> .. ..	Carlsruhe, 2½ miles west.
<i>Water Supply</i> .. ..	House 200 yards south.
<i>Workshops</i> .. ..	Woodend garages.
<i>Hangar Accommodation</i>	Nil.
<i>Nearest Telephone</i> ..	Mr. Foreman, "Mt. Pleasant," 3 miles west.
<i>Nearest Telegraph</i> ..	Carlsruhe Railway Station.
<i>Nearest Town</i> .. ..	Carlsruhe, about 2½ miles west.
<i>Nearest Railway Station</i>	Carlsruhe, about 4 miles south-west.
<i>Charges</i> .. ..	Nil.
<i>Remarks</i> .. ..	<del>A good emergency landing ground.</del> In wet season aeroplanes should land on the southern portions of the ground. N.T.A. 1/27.
