


CLASS OF GROUND: Aerodrome suitable for all types of landplanes.
PROPRIETORS: Administration, Territory of New Guinea.
POSITION: East of Zoya Creek, about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles S.S.E. of Kaiapit Mission Station.

Lat. $6^{\circ} 17'$ S. Long. $146^{\circ} 17'$ E.

MAGNETIC VARIATION: $4\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. approx.

LANDMARKS: Flat valley about 6 miles east of Markham River; Kaiapit Mission Station $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles N.N.W.

MARKINGS: Nil.

DESCRIPTION: One-way ground of cut kunai grass with an additional run of 165 yards through uncut kunai grass at southern end.

DIMENSIONS: A single strip, 725 yards long by about 76 yards wide (See sketch).

HEIGHT ABOVE SEA LEVEL: 900 ft. approx.

APPROACHES: Open at both ends of runway.

SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Scattered timber to west, timbered foothills about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile east, timbered range to east, extensive alluvial flats sparsely timbered to west.

PETROL AND OIL: Nil.

WATER SUPPLY: At creeks nearby.

WORKSHOPS: Lae, 60 miles S.E.

HANGAR ACCOMMODATION: Nil.

TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH: Private radio at Lae.

NEAREST TOWN AND SEAPORT: Lae, about 70 miles by road S.E.

CHARGES: Nil at present.

REMARKS: The uncut extension at southern end should be safe for large aeroplanes.
