


EMERGENCY LANDING GROUND



LATITUDE: 34° 37' S; LONGITUDE: 150° 29½' E; MAG. VAR: 9° E. app.  
ALTITUDE: 1,900 feet approx.

POSITION: About 2 miles east of Mittagong township, adjacent to old Sydney Road.

RELEVANT AVIATION MAPS: Mercator Sheet J.9. Stripmaps Nos. 12, 43 and 73.

SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Timbered and hilly. Generally the cleared paddocks have a few stumps and washouts.

LANDMARKS: Road along NW and SW boundaries. Creek along SE boundary. Monastery about ½ mile south.

APPROACHES: NE - open; NW - over 25 ft. high tension line along road, timber and rising ground; SE - over timber and rising ground; SW - over 18 ft. tel. line.

MARKINGS: White cross and wind indicator.

DIMENSIONS: 1,000 yards long by 190 yards wide.

SURFACE: Fair.

TOWN & RAILWAY STATION: Mittagong, 2 miles west.

TELEPHONE: Mittagong.

HANGARS: Nil.

REPAIRS & REFUELLING: Mittagong.

WATER: At house nearby.

PROPRIETORS: Department of Civil Aviation, Melbourne.

CHARGES: Nil.

SPECIAL REMARKS: The NE end of the ground is subject to washouts and should be avoided.
