



## NOTICE TO AIRMEN

TUMUT, N.S.W.



**CLASS OF GROUND:** Aerodrome suitable for all types of landplanes.

**PROPRIETORS:** Executors of the estate of the late H.L. Harris.

(Manager: Mr. H.L.V. Harris, "Wermatong", Tumut, N.S.W.)

**POSITION:**  $4\frac{1}{2}$  miles E.S.E. of Tumut.

Lat:  $35^{\circ} 20'$  S. Long:  $148^{\circ} 17\frac{1}{2}'$  E.

**MAGNETIC VARIATION:**  $8\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E. Approx.

**LANDMARKS:** Roads along north and east boundaries.

Road junction at N.E. corner.

**MARKINGS:** White circle and wind indicator.

**SURFACE:** Grassy, subject to flood in wet weather.

**DIMENSIONS:** North-South 660 yards; East-West 790 yards.

**HEIGHT ABOVE SEA LEVEL:** 900 ft. approx.

**APPROACHES:** North and East - clear; S.E. - timber 35 ft. high;

West - windmill 20 ft. high.

**SURROUNDING COUNTRY:** Hilly and timbered, unsuitable for forced landings.

**PETROL, OIL & WORKSHOPS:** Tumut, 6 miles by road.

**WATER SUPPLY:** Houses adjacent.

**HANGAR ACCOMMODATION:** Nil.

**TELEPHONE:** At house  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles S.E. (Tumut 82).

**TELEGRAPH:** Tumut P.O.

**NEAREST TOWN & RAILWAY STATION:** Tumut, 6 miles W.N.W. by road.

**REMARKS:** This aerodrome is suitable for use in dry weather only.

After heavy rain the surface becomes very boggy.

Pilots should look out for stock grazing on the aerodrome.




EMERGENCY LANDING GROUND



LATITUDE: 35° 20' S; LONGITUDE: 148° 17½' E; MAG. VAR: 8½° E app.

ALTITUDE: 900 feet approx.

POSITION: About 4½ miles ESE of Tumut.

RELEVANT AVIATION MAP: Mercator Sheet K.9.

SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Hilly and timbered; unsuitable for forced landings.

LANDMARKS: Roads along N and E boundaries; road junction at NE corner.

APPROACHES: North - clear. South - over few trees. East and west - clear, except for 20 ft. windmill.

MARKINGS: White cross, wind indicator and boundary marks.

DIMENSIONS: N-S, 660 yds. E-W, 790 yds.

SURFACE: Fair.

TOWN &amp; RAILWAY STATION: Tumut, 4½ miles WNW.

TELEPHONE: At house, 1½ miles SE (Tumut 82).

HANGARS: Nil.

REPAIRS &amp; REFUELLING: Tumut.

WATER: At nearby houses.

PROPRIETORS: Department of Civil Aviation, Melbourne.

CHARGES: Nil.
