



NOTICE TO AIRMEN

NO. 27/1935.

WAMPIT, N.G.



CLASS OF GROUND: One-way Emergency Landing Ground.

PROPRIETORS: Administration, Territory of New Guinea.

POSITION: On right bank of the Wampit River, about 26 miles west of Lae. Lat. $6^{\circ}45\frac{1}{2}'S$. Long. $146^{\circ}41'E$.

MAGNETIC VARIATION: $5\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}E$. approx.

DISTINCTIVE FEATURES: Clearing surrounded by "kunai"* and scattered timber. Wampit River about 220 yards to the west.

MARKINGS: Nil.

DESCRIPTION: Single runway, approximately north-east and south-west.

DIMENSIONS: N.E. - S.W. 440 yards, by 88 yards wide.

HEIGHT ABOVE SEA LEVEL: 500 ft. approx.

APPROACHES: North - Over gorge, opening out to scattered trees standing in kunai.

South - Scattered trees in kunai with bushes near landing ground. Ridge along south and south-east.

SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Hills to north, east and west, valley of Wampit River to the west. Sago swamps to the east.

Ridge along south and south-east.

PETROL AND OIL: Nil.

WATER SUPPLY: Wampit River.

WORKSHOPS: Lae and Bulwa.

HANGAR ACCOMMODATION: Nil.

TELEPHONE: Not available.

TELEGRAPH: Not available.

NEAREST VILLAGE: Saab, 5 miles north.

NEAREST RAILWAY STATION: None in district.

CHARGES: Nil.

REMARKS: Three native labourers live at ground, taking care of upkeep etc.

Mosquitoes generally very bad. Game plentiful nearby.

Native houses on western side of landing ground.

* Kunai is a tall, tussocky grass.
