


EMERGENCY LANDING GROUND



LATITUDE: $34^{\circ} 05' S$; LONGITUDE: $141^{\circ} 54' E$; MAG. VAR: $6\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E$. app.

ALTITUDE: 150 feet approx.

POSITION: About 2 miles NW of Wentworth township.

RELEVANT AVIATION MAPS: Mercator Sheet J.8. Stripmaps Nos. 70 and 73.

SURROUNDING COUNTRY: Rough, but suitable for forced landings.

LANDMARKS: Ground is immediately west of racecourse.

APPROACHES: Tel. lines, 18 ft. high on south boundary and to north; otherwise clear.

MARKINGS: White circle and wind indicator.

DIMENSIONS: N-S, 520 yards. E-W, 590 yards.

SURFACE: Good.

TOWN: Wentworth, 2 miles SE.

RAILWAY STATION: Yelta, Victoria, about 3 miles SE.

TELEPHONE: Wentworth.

HANGARS: Nil.

REPAIRS & REFUELLING: Wentworth.

WATER: Tanks on racecourse.

PROPRIETORS: Department of Civil Aviation, Melbourne.

CHARGES: Nil.

SPECIAL REMARKS: Suitable in dry weather only.
